

We are nurtured in the cultural tradition of China, combined with the creativity of contemporary art, to impress the world with Chinese dance of Hong Kong character.

Established in 1981, Hong Kong Dance Company (HKDance) is committed to promoting Chinese dance with contemporary artistic visions and Hong Kong character. Since its inception, HKDance has staged over two hundred productions, many of which have been highly popular and critically acclaimed. Recent productions include The Legend of Mulan, Red Poppies, Spring Ritual · Eulogy, The Butterfly Lovers, Storm Clouds, L'Amour Immortel, Dream of the Past: Ancient Chinese Court Dances, Reveries of the Red Chamber, Chinese Hero: A Lone Exile, Vipassana, Lady White of West Lake, Tale of Three Cities, Waiting Heart, Liu Sanjie, Ode to the Silk Road, Dance of Strings, A Tale of the Southern Sky, Mazu the Sea Goddess, The Moon Opera, Shan Shui: An Ode to Nature, Nine Songs, Nezha: Untold Solitude, Myth of the Dancing Durumi, A Dance of Celestial Rhythms, After Snowfall, and Convergence, a culmination of an interdisciplinary Research Study on Chinese Martial Arts and Chinese Dance. In 2023, the excerpt Whispers of the Pines from Convergence was recognised in the 13th China Dance Lotus Awards (Contemporary Dance), the most prestigious national dance awards in China.

As a cultural ambassador of Hong Kong, HKDance consistently showcases the city's unique artistic style to the world by touring to different cities across the globe, engaging local audiences, and encouraging cultural exchange. In recent years, we have brought our award-winning productions to Lincoln Center in New York, The Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., Sony Centre in Toronto, The Concourse Theatre and Seymour Centre in Sydney, Southbank Centre in London, Belarusian State Academic Musical Theatre in Minsk, Arko Arts Theatre in Seoul, Askra Theatre King Power in Bangkok, Tokyo FM Hall, Ishikawa Ongakudo in Kanazawa, One Theatre Hall in Penang, National Centre for the Performing Arts in Beijing, Beijing Tiangiao Performing Arts Center, Shanghai Grand Theatre, Shanghai International Dance Center, Hangzhou Grand Theatre, Guangzhou Opera House, Kaiming Theatre in Suzhou, Xinjiang Art Theater, Taipei New Stage, and Taiwan Traditional Theatre Center, among others.

HKDance established the Children's Troupe in 2006, subsequently expanding its initiatives with the formtation of the Youth Troupe. It comprehensively elevates arts training and appreciation for children and young people aged between 4 and 18 who have a passion for dance. Their unique, innovative educational model "Training – Performance – Appreciation" allows students to understand themselves, uncover hidden potential, build self-esteem, and advance their personal artistic development.

The Troupes have participated in and won the highest honours at the China National Children's Dance Competition, successfully establishing their own youth dance brand. In addition to performing in a large-scale dance programme every year, the Troupes also take an active role in cultural exchange events, having visited Beijing, Qingdao, Shanghai, Shenzhen, Panyu, Guangzhou, Taiwan, Sabah (Malaysia), Jinan, Singapore and the Greater Bay Area for exchanges and demonstrations. The Troupes provide exceptional and professional dance training to young people aspiring to dance as a career, offering a more specialised training path to enter The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts (HKAPA) or other professional institutions.

From 2001 to 2007, Cai Fei worked at Guangdong Dance School as a full-time instructor of basic Chinese dance techniques and rehearsal classes, fully committed to dance education. During this period, Cai was awarded the School's Outstanding Teacher Award and the Outstanding Class Mistress Award. She furthered her studies at the Beijing Academy of Dance, majoring in Ballet.

Cai joined HKDance in 2008, appearing in such major productions as *The Legend of Mulan, Red Poppies*, *Qingming Riverside*, and *Princess Changping*. She is currently the Artistic Coordinator of the HKDance Children's & Youth Troupes, responsible for teaching, choreography, devising basic training materials, and administration.

Between 2008 and 2024, Cai served as an Artistic Coordinator and Choreographer for Childhood Wonderland, The Happy Prince, Dim Sum Adventures @ Lung Fung Teahouse, Magical Adventures of Baby Polar Bear and the 12 Zodiac Animals, and The Kids in Rainbow Jerseys. She also planned various dance training camps, as well as organising and leading groups on cultural exchanges and in dance competitions in Taiwan, Beijing, Guangzhou, and Qingdao.

A graduate of the Guangdong Dance Academy's Chinese Dance Performance and Education Department, Ke Zhiyong was a silver medalist at the 1996 Guangdong Province Dance Competition. He has also won multiple accolades at the Taoli Cup Dance Competition: recognition of excellence in the Youth (B) category (1994); gold medal in the Youth (A) category (1997) and third prize at the Young Adult category (2000). Ke was a recipient of the 7th Hong Kong Dance Awards in 2005.

A member of HKDance since 2001, Ke was promoted to Senior Dancer in 2007. Two years later, Ke enrolled at the Beijing Dance Academy in Chinese classical dance pedagogy, receiving a professional certificate in the discipline. Between 2010 and 2012, Ke served as guest instructor in the Chinese Dance division of The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts. He is currently Dance Master at HKDance. Ke has performed in more than 40 dance dramas, mainly in lead roles. He was assistant choreographer of many dance dramas. He was also co-choreographer of the children's dance dramas Childhood Wonderland, Magical Adventures of Baby Polar Bear and the 12 Zodiac Animals, Saturday Whispers and artistic coordinator of Fun Ride with Big Beard - Dancing Poems, Dancing World - The Story of a Blissful Tribe and The Kids in Rainbow Jerseys. Recent choreographic work includes The Lion Dance in Lands in the South.

A graduate of The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts and the Beijing Dance Academy, Wu Kam-ming was among the top ten performers in the folk dance category of the 1997 Taoli Cup Dance Competition. In 2003, he was recognised as an Outstanding Hong Kong Young Dancer. Wu is now a freelance dancer, dance instructor and Artistic Director of Jay Dance Company.

Wu was formerly a guest instructor at the HKAPA. While Wu was a full-time member of HKDance, he performed in roles such as Monkey King in Journey to the West, the title role in Pinocchio, Hans Christian Andersen in King of Fairy Tales – The Eternal Child, Dongfang Bubai in The Smiling, Proud Wanderer. He also served as the assistant choreographer for The Butterfly Lovers; The Border Town; King of Fairy Tales; The Smiling, Proud Wanderer and Qingming Riverside. 




Deputy Artistic Coordinator/ Choreographer and Rehearsal Coach

Scriptwriter

Simon Wang Haoran is a Hong Kong playwright, a director, a dramaturg and the founder of "Theatre Invert", serving as Creative Director. He received his Master of Fine Art's Degree in Drama from The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts with Distinction, majoring in Playwriting under Poon Wai Sum. Original plays Blast (2013) and The Red Chamber in the Forest Sea (2014) were produced by the Hong Kong Arts Festival and enjoyed full-house audiences for both works. Pride, produced by the Hong Kong Repertory Theatre, received the IATC(HK) Critic Award for Best Script/Playwright in 2019.

Haoran was served as a resident-artist in New York, receiving the Asian Cultural Council full fellowship in 2015 and was invited as a visiting artist at Yale University. In 2017, he was invited to participate in the joint cultivation program of the British Council and the Royal Court Theatre, creating and directing the self-written work *Game Boy* and selected for the 8th Wuzhen Theatre Festival's Special Invited play. The play *Stranger* was produced and premiered at the Shanghai Dramatic Arts Centre, and in 2024, the same theatre company staged the major production *Journey to the West*, for which Haoran serves as the dramaturg. His translation and dramaturg production of the Hong Kong Arts Festival's *Crime and Punishment* was staged in 2025. Haoran has also collaborated with and worked for various companies such as Edko Films, Tencent TiMi Studios, and Lilith Games. He combines sharp insight with humor to offer a distinctive perspective on interpreting cultural differences and phenomena.

A graduate in composition of the Music Department of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, Yin Ng went on to study at the International Christian University in Tokyo (Japanese language) and Codarts in Holland (jazz), conferred as Best Artist (Music) at the 2012 Hong Kong Arts Development Awards. He is a three-time winner in the Best Serious Composition category at the CASH Golden Sail Music Awards: the theatrical choral concert Rock Hard (2009), double sheng concerto Before the City Collapses (2013) and Ji for Chinese orchestra (2022). In addition, his choral piece Singing Voices of the World was a two-time-winner of the CASH Golden Sail Most Performed Works Award (Serious Music). Ng has composed music for such large-scale productions as HKDance's dance dramas L'Amour Immortel and Lady White of West Lake, as well as such works for the HKDC Children's and Youth Troupes: A Sea of Smilling LT Ducks, Saturday Whispers, Fun Ride with the Big Beard – Dancing Poems and The Kids in Rainbow Jerseys.

Ng has also composed and produced a large number of children's music for various groups, including *Handwashing Song* (Mcdull), the Hong Kong Chinese Orchestra's *Let's play Chinese Music*, and the Centre for Health Protection (CHP) of the Department of Health's *Hand Hygiene Animation*. Ng launched the "Yat Yat Yat Kids Song" project in 2022 to create more Cantonese songs for local children. He is also the artistic director, composer and arranger of the *Little Kids Jazz World* and *Little Kids Winter Jazz World* Family Concerts.

Ng's orchestral works include the drumset concerto *Fly*, the Chinese orchestral work *Tang Resonating*, the film score for Mcdull's *The Pork of Music*, Jimmy Liao's theatre concert *I wish I Could Make a Wish*, the Hong Kong Children's Choir's musical *Magical Beanland*, International Arts Carnival 2022's *Sing Along With Lok Lok* and many others. He has collaborated with many companies and singers including the Hong Kong Children's Choir, Yip's Children's Choral and Performing Arts Centre, Hong Kong Treble Choir, Hong Kong Chinese Orchestra, Hong Kong Sinfonietta, Hins Cheung, Joey Yung, Eason Chan, Manson Cheung and many others.



Music Director/ Composer



Hong Kong pop song lyricist and lyricist tutor Cheung Cho-kiu has published more than a hundred pop songs. One of her songs reached number 7 in the IFPI Global Top Ten Digital Singles Award. She was also the winner of the CASH Golden Sail Music Award for the Most Widely Performed Song in 2018 and the Top Ten Chinese Gold Songs Awards in 2021.

She has collaborated with many singers including Kelly Chen, Hins Cheung, Karen Mok, Leon Lai, Twins, Janice Vidal, Jordan Chan, Raymond Lam, Angela Hui, Ken Hung, Karen Tong, and Gigi Yim.

Cheung's love for Cantonese song lyrics was inspired by renowned lyricist Lin Xi's book"原來你非不快樂". In 2011, she enrolled in a lyric writing course led by Lin Xi at the Baron School of Music. She was recommended to and signed as a contract lyricist for famous musician Ronald Ng. In recent years, she has expanded into the world of theatre and has worked closely as a lyricist with local theatre troupes.

Bacchus graduated in Theatre Set and Costume Design from the HKAPA; an MA in Scenography from Central Saint Martins College of Art and Design; and an MA in Visual Culture Studies from the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

He began his career as a set designer for Asia Television Ltd. Afterward, he joined the Chung Ying Theatre Company in 1994 as a resident designer. In 2003, he joined The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts as an artist-in-residence, and in 2005, became a lecturer for the Design Department. Bacchus Lee is currently Head of Theatre Design and a Senior Lecturer in Design.



### **China Hong Kong Para Dance Sport Association**



Wong Kin-hung is an experienced para dance athlete, certified in wheelchair dance sport and a member of the Hong Kong Para Dance Sport Representative Team. He has achieved outstanding results in international competitions, including second place in the 2024 Astana Asia Pacific Open Championships (Combi Freestyle Class 2), first place in the 2024 Taiwan Dazhong Cup Team Dance, and third place in the 2025 Hong Kong Para Dance Sport International Open. In 2023, he also competed in the Genoa World Championships (Combi Latin, 16<sup>th</sup> place) and the Tokyo International Para Dance Sport Competition (Combi Latin, 13<sup>th</sup> place), demonstrating consistent performance. Additionally, Wong actively participates in major performances, including the 2019 Hong Kong Boccia World Open Ceremony, the 2023 International Inclusive Dance Festival, and several wheelchair Chinese folk dance showcases at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre, such as *Ink Charm, Body Charm*, and *Flying with Drums*.

Matthew Yu is an outstanding para dance athlete who began competing in 2023, earning eighth place in the Men's Single Class 2 category at the World Championships in Genoa, Italy. In 2024, he won the runner-up title in the Men's Single Class 2 and third place in the Combi Latin category at the Asia Pacific Para Dance Sport Championships. He also excelled at the Beigang Para Dance Sport International Competition (Mazu Cup), claiming the Wheelchair Latin Five-Dance Championship, third place in Men's Single Class 2, and fourth place in Combi Latin. That same year, he ranked second in Asia and fifth globally for Men's Single Class 2, and sixth in Asia and eighth globally for Combi Latin. In 2025, at the Hong Kong Para Dance Sport International Competition, he secured the runner-up position in Men's Single Class 2, first place in Combi Latin Class 2, and second place in Combi Freestyle, showcasing his exceptional talent.





So Tze-yan, Susanna is an athlete in wheelchair dance sports who has achieved outstanding results in international competitions. In 2025, she earned double runner-up titles in the Grade 2 Mixed Latin and Standard Dance categories, as well as a runner-up title in the Grade 2 Women's Solo Dance category at the Hong Kong Wheelchair Dance International Competition. In 2024, she won the Grade 2 Mixed Standard and Latin Dance championships at the Majestic Wheelchair Dance Tournament in the UK and a gold medal in the Grade 2 Mixed Latin Dance category at the Asia and Pacific Championships in Astana, along with multiple silver and bronze medals. In 2019, she won three gold medals in Mixed Latin Dance at the China National Games and five gold medals in Mixed Latin Dance at the German Mannheim Cup International Standard Dance Championship.

She also participates in community and educational activities, including school workshops, Hong Kong Disneyland parades, and performances at the Hong Kong Games opening ceremony, promoting wheelchair dance and inclusive culture.

Evina Wong is a para dance sport athlete and coach who has been competing internationally since 2016, achieving notable results in various competitions. She is an elite athlete at the Hong Kong Sports Institute and holds certifications as a para dance sport athlete and coach. Evina's achievements include winning the Combi Standard Class 2 championship at the 2024 Beigang International Competition, the 2017 Starlight World Para Dance Open championship, and securing third place at the 2024 Asia Pacific Championships. Additionally, she actively participates in major performances, such as the International Inclusive Dance Festival and Hong Kong Disneyland's International Day of Persons with Disabilities, promoting para dance and inclusive culture. She has also performed in productions like *Ink Spirit* and *Shen Yun* at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre, contributing to the promotion of wheelchair Chinese ethnic dance.




